

II. Tuning the Guitar:

First, play an "E" on a piano or pitchpipe and then Tighten or loosen the tension on the sixth string to that it produces a low pitched sound of E. THEN:

- 1. Pressthe 6th string at the 5th fret and then strike the 6th string; This is the pitch to which the open(not fingered)5th string should be tuned.
- 2. Press the 5th string at the 5th fret and strike the 5th string; This is the pitch to which the open 4th string should be tuned.
- 3. Press the 4th string at the 5th fret and strike the 4th string; This is the pitch to which the open 3rd string should be tuned.
- 4. Press the 3rd string at the 4th fret and then strike the 3rd string. This is the pitch to which the spen 2nd string should be tuned.
- 5. Press the 2nd string at the 5th fret and strike the 2nd string; This is the pitch to which the open 1st string should be tuned.
- p.s. You can easily tune by phone to someone else's pitch pipe, piano, or guitar.
- III. CHANGING KEYS: Sometimes you need to raise or lower a key of a song to better fit your voive range. There are 2 ways to do this:
  - 1.CAPO A capo is a clamp device that when placed on the guitar frets shortens the string length and thus raises the pitch ½ step with each fret. Treating the capo as the nut of the guitar, you may continue to use your original chords while raising the vocal range of the song -or lower the range by then being able to sing an owtave lower.
  - 2.Transposition: To transpose means to change the music from one key to another key. If the original chords for a song are in a key which is too low or too high for your voice range, you may change the key to a more suitable one by transposing the chords according to the chart below:



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


